### When are Open Door Sessions?

Our sessions are held virtually on the third Tuesday of every month at either 10:00 am
or 1:00 pm. This year Second Story is planning on hosting three in-person sessions at
Second Story for Teens in Crisis on Gallows Road. Those sessions will be in April, June,
and October. There will be two time slots available: 11:00 am and 1:00 pm. Our inperson sessions will replace the virtual sessions during those months.

# Is this a fundraising event?

NO! Open Door Information Sessions are not fundraising events, rather they are
opportunities for us to tell you more about our programs. If you choose to attend an inperson session, you can expect to get a glimpse into our Second Story for Teens in Crisis
program.

 Attendees can expect to hear from leadership and staff, learn about issues faced by youth experiencing homelessness and other crises, right here in Fairfax County, and see how our programs are helping our community.
